In July we went through our validation visit and were awarded our NAC Accreditation through August 2028. September all new windows were installed in the infant/toddler classroom, new paint in both upstairs and lower-level classrooms, new window treatments and all new carpets throughout the entire building to complete the project. Thank you to all the families for making alternate arrangements to allow for all these projects to be completed. This month, we are excited to announce that we have purchased a new bus that will be on the road in December. Lots to be thankful for this year.

A huge thank you to Emanuel Church's Mission Committee for providing 300 servings of sloppy joes, carrots, apples and cookies (decorated by the preschool children). Darling Dragonflies

In November the Dragonflies learned manners, emotions, about community helpers and how they help us and others and having an attitude of gratitude. Our Dragonflies learned that having good manners and recognizing emotions are vital for creating strong connections and improving communication skills. The highlights of November: our class had enjoyed watching the season fully change by watching the leaves fall from the trees and jumping into big piles of them! We also did lots of art!

In December our class themes will cover:

Science is crucial for toddlers as it helps them understand the world around them, fosters curiosity and encourages critical thinking which lays a strong foundation for future learning. It also promotes exploration and discovery, making learning fun and interactive at an early age. We are planning lots of fun science experiments for the week!

Snow and Ice; by engaging with these elements can spark curiosity, promote sensory exploration, and encourage imaginative play. It also provides opportunities for discussions about weather, seasons, and the environment.

Our 5 Senses; by tapping into our senses, it helps us explore and make sense of the world around us through sight, taste, scent, touch and sound.

Celebrating Jesus' birthday which introduces the children to the values of love, kindness, and giving. Understanding this celebration helps them connect with family traditions and fosters a sense of community.

Our goals for the Dragonflies this month are to continue implementing manners into our everyday dialogue and activities. We are also focusing on using utensils full time except when eating finger foods. We encourage parents to promote spoon and fork usage at home as well!
