A special thank you to all the parents who came out to see our "Jesus' Birthday Celebration". The children did an amazing job playing their drums.

Some of our featured highlights this past month were the science experiments we did during the week of "Mad Science". The children made homemade lemonade. They squeezed lemon into a pitcher, added water and sugar and stirred everything together. Then they picked out their favorite-colored skittle and dropped it into the lemonade. As they waited patiently to see what would happen, they noticed that the lemonade was slowly changing colors. The lemonade had changed to the color of the skittle they picked out. What excitement on their little faces as they started to tell the teachers what color their lemonade was turning into. They couldn't wait to taste it. If you haven't gotten a chance to look at our display of learning board for this activity, please stop in and take a look. In it you will find what they learned, said, and materials the children used to make the science experiment.

We have some awesome themes planned for the month of January. They include "Animals that hibernate", "Arctic animals", "Transportation" and "Shadows and Lights'. During the week of hibernation, the children will learn which animals sleep in winter and where they sleep. One of the books we will be reading is "Bear Snores On" by Karma Wilson. A story about a bear who is sleeping in his cave and one by one, different animals and birds find their way out of the cold and into his cave to stay warm. While the animals brew their tea and pop their popcorn, the bear continues to sleep and snore. This has been one of the children's favorite books to read during hibernation season. We will also create shadow silhouettes of each child during the week of "Shadows and Light". The children have been learning the different names of Jesus, and during this week we will learn what it means to shine our lights and represent Jesus, the true Light of the World.

Now that the cold season is here, we are asking if you can please bring snowpants, snow boots, hats, and gloves for your child. We do have extras just in case but find the children are more comfortable wearing their own clothes. We go outside a lot, especially when it snows. Also remember to check your child's art folders, located by the parent board in the classroom.
